



**Social Ecological Approach (SEA) with Dr. Michael Ungar –
September 2018 Training opportunities at Brodhagen Community Hall
REGISTRATION FORM**

The SEA is a promising practice that provides training in discrete skills that enhance collaboration and communication among community partners to enable them to deal even more effectively with children and youth with the most complex needs and their families. SEA philosophies shift the focus from “fixing the kid and/or family” to creating an environment or system around the child and family that builds on child and family strengths and promotes resiliency. One of the strengths of SEA is that it provides a “conceptual bucket” that can hold any other practice or intervention, but strengthens these interventions by promoting a common language and framework that can be embraced by all partners in the service system.

The Huron Perth Child & Youth Mental Health Network is offering this training for community partners to strengthen our capacity to collaborate and effectively respond to children and youth with complex mental health needs. This project builds on the Senior Leaders Engagement Day held in October 2017. Better collaboration and coordination of services at both the case and interagency levels have been identified as very high priorities at our community planning table as well as in other sectors.

Level 1 Training – Monday, Sept 17, 2018

Approximate cost is \$40-61* for training, book and lunch

One day of training to provide participants with the fundamental principles and concepts of SEA so that they can understand how cases are being formulated and support some, perhaps less traditional, strategies or interventions that may be proposed. This day will focus on the material from Dr. Ungar’s “Nine Things Kids Need....” book and has content similar to the senior staff engagement day held in October 2017. It is open to any staff identified by the organization.

Level 2 Training* – Tuesday, Sept 18, 2018 and Wednesday, Sept 19, 2018

Approximate cost is \$80-122* for training, book and lunch for two days

Two full days of training, geared more toward front line staff who have direct contact with children, youth and families so that they can learn the 20 navigation and negotiation skills that Dr. Ungar has identified as improving resilience and clinical outcomes.
